TERMS OF REFERENCE SUPPLY & DELIVERY OF SHEEP SHEARING EQUIPMENT

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1. BACKGROUND AND OVERVIEW OF THE PROJECT

1.1 PURPOSE

These terms of reference outlines ANDA's intention to recruit suitable service provider for procurement, supply and delivery of sheep shearing equipment in line with the scope of work. Livestock in Alfred Nzo is one of the sectors that make a sizeable contribution to employment. The successful service provider shall perform the required services in line with high quality standards and shall follow all the scope of work as well as deliverables indicated in this TOR.

1.2. BACKGROUND

There are different types of sheep breeds in South Africa ranging from the indigenous, locally developed and to the recognised exotic sheep breeds. Sheep in South Africa are found in intensive, semi-intensive and extensive production systems. It is very important to farm with an appropriate breed type that is well-adapted to the local production environment and production system. This programme thus proposes the following to exploit the opportunities in the sector:

This project will be implemented through support of up to 4 Wool growers associations with shearing equipment in 4 different Local Municipalities of the District. This will expose communal wool farmers to modern livestock farming technologies and allow them to learn new and optimal production practices for successful enterprises.

The programme seeks to develop communal farmers and black smallholder fibre producers to join the commercial animal fibre production value chain which will contribute to inclusivity and stability in the sector as the NDP Vision 2030. Jobs will be created, rural economy will be enhanced which can lead to reduced unemployment, improved rural development and better quality of life of currently poor smallholder communities.

2. PROJECT OBJECTIVES

This Request for Proposals seeks to invite prospective service provider(s) to submit a quotation for supply and delivery of sheep shearing equipment.

3. SCOPE OF WORK

Competent service providers are hereby invited to submit proposals to supply sheep shearing equipment within a period of 1 month. A service provider is sought to undertake the following:

 Procurement and distribution of shearing equipment to selected Farmer associations in 4 Local Municipalities across the District(Mbizana, Umzimvubu, Matatiele and Ntabankulu)

- The service provider shall deliver these shearing equipment to selected Farmer associations in 4 Local Municipalities across the District within 30 days after receiving official order.
- All shearing equipment delivered must have at least One (1) year warranty which is to be effective on the date that ANDA takes possession of the equipment and must be stipulated on the quote
- The service provider shall provide full details of the equipment warranties/guarantees
- Any damaged items as a result of manufacture or acquisition, transportation, storage and delivery must be replaced with new and unused item
- The service provider shall provide a call center number to be used by ANDA for any technical queries.
- The service provider shall provide owner's manual and service schedule as a standard at no additional cost with the equipment.

4. Project Methodology

The service provider must provide a detailed outline on how the scope of work is to be achieved.

To draft a project proposal that should detail the methodology or approach of the project including project
activities, and budget allocated thereto and depicts time frame for each activity where the overall project
duration will be for a period not more than 1 month.

5. Project Deliverables/Milestones

On conclusion of the project the following deliverables must have been achieved:

 Sheep shearing equipment procured and distributed to selected wool associations in 4 Local Municipalities in line with the scope of work as well as detailed specification.

6. MINIMUM MANDATORY SUBMISSION REQUIREMENTS

In order to complete the project successfully ensure quality in the output. The following minimum submissions will be required from service provider(s) submitting proposals. Failure to adhere to this format requirement will lead to the bid being regarded as non-compliant.

- Clear financial breakdown of a proposed cost / commercial offer on the required equipment in line with detailed Specification.
- Company profile indicating the core activities and number of years the service provider has been involved in similar services

- The company must have a minimum of three (3) year's proven track record and experience in the following: Livestock/Animal Production, Animal Health and genetics. (three contactable reference letters must be attached)
- The company must have an employee/Director registered with South African Veterinary Council (SAVC) as a Certified Veterinarian Professional (Attach proof of registration and employment)
- Service provider to provide the full specification of the equipment they quoted on

7. COMPLIANCE REQUIREMENTS

Note to Prospective Bidders: Compulsory submissions (Failure to submit any of the following will result in disqualification).

- Valid SARS pin number confirmation certificate to be included.
- Municipal clearance certificate certifying that no municipal rates and service charges are owed by the bidder and any of its directors to Alfred Nzo District Municipality or to any other municipality where the bidder's business operations are located, are in arrears for more than three months/ Proof of residence/Lease agreement
- Copies of ID Documents and all submitted certificates must be certified with a certification that is not older than 3 months.
- The bid will be evaluated according to the Preferential Procurement Regulations 2022
- Company profile with traceable references
- Joint Venture agreement should be in JV agreement forma (If applicable)
- All bidders should complete MBD 1, MBD 4, MBD 8, MBD9
- All prospective service providers of goods and services and infrastructure procurement are to be registered on Central Database in order to do business with all organs of state in the Republic of South Africa.

8. SELECTION AND EVALUATION CRITERIA

ANDA subscribes to the Preferential Procurement Regulations 2022, pertaining to the Preferential Procurement Policy Framework Act (PPPFA) principles whereby a bidder's submission will be evaluated according to the sum of the award of points in respect of the tender value and Specific Goals.

Price and Preference goal 3 will be used for evaluation. The 80/20 preferential point system will be applicable, with 80 points for price and 20 points for Specific Goals.

The bids will be evaluated in two stages, namely:

- Stage 1- Minimum compliance and mandatory responsiveness criteria
- Stage 2 Price and Preference Point system (Goal 3)

Bids will be evaluated in terms of the SCM Policy of Alfred Nzo Development Agency and shall be applied as follows: -

All proposals received shall firstly be evaluated on Minimum compliance and mandatory responsiveness criteria and then after the Preference Point system will be applicable.

The submitted proposals are to be evaluated using the 80/20 preference points system in accordance with the PPPFA guidelines. Based on this system the points will be allocated as follows:

- Price 80%
- Specific Goal 3 20%

Only service provider(s) that can demonstrate the required experience and skills relating to the execution of this project will be considered. The following criteria will be taken into account for the appointment of a successful Service provider(s).
